I sat reflecting about this article, trying to find the right angle, especially in these days when we have not been able to be so externally active. A few hours later, I sat at a table to celebrate Shavuot and looking around the table, realized that the Lord had once again gathered a group of TJCII Now Generation folks from Austria, Slovakia, and Hungary. There we were, all Roman Catholics, reflecting on the Feast of Shavuot, reading from the Book of Ruth, grateful that we might be found in the person of Ruth as Gentile believers. We were not busy doing anything specifically for TJCII. We were just living TJCII, experiencing the fruit of TJCII in our lives, and interceding on that night for all Jewish people around the world. We sat, once again, in the flat overlooking the 700 year old synagogue in Hainburg, and prayed that the Lord would restore that place to be a place of welcome for His people Israel and that His Holy Name would again be lifted up in that place.

On the weekend of March 6–8, 2020, Eyal Friedman came from Jerusalem to Austria for a five day TJCII journey, which included a weekend of teaching for people interested in these topics. We also had several visits with key leaders, including a Serbian Orthodox priest. The trip was organized by TJCII Austria, which is led by two of our Now Generation, Anja Hoffman and Florian Vorisek. The teaching weekend was well received, and several from that weekend will attend the upcoming TJCII Come and See Course in Hainburg.

Our Brazilian Now Generation brothers and sisters, along with the entire Brazil team has been continually active during this time of COVID–19, often meeting online for prayer and planning. Earlier in May, they planned an online sharing and intercession meeting. I quote Mattheus Alves' report of the meeting: “. . .We had more than 60 devices connected. Even people from other countries, like Argentina, Portugal, and the USA. We also had an indigenous pastor from the far north of Brazil. . .It took two and half hours, and we could feel God's presence and the weight of His heart. . .Let us continue! There is so much more!”
